



# Rule of Law



**At Kingsway we recognise the importance of laws and rules. We develop fair rules for our class and school and know that we have a responsibility to follow them. We also recognise that there are laws that govern the country.**

At Kingsway we promote the Rule of Law through:

- Our system of behaviour management is based on clear school rules, sanctions and expectations.
- All children are involved in agreeing and setting class and school behaviour expectations.
  - Children know 'right from wrong' and if they break a school rule they are involved in a discussion about their behaviour and the consequences.
  - Children are encouraged to take part in problem solving and resolving conflicts as they arise.
- Children and adults are aware of the importance of being on time for school and attending every day.
- Children are encouraged to follow the school uniform policy and staff dress in a professional manner.
- All staff lead by example. Everybody within school is treated with respect and spoken to in a dignified manner.
- We reinforce positive behaviour through praise and rewards.
  - Children's achievements and successes are recognised during Achievement Assembly on a Friday.
- Year 5 and 6 take part in DARE (Drug Abuse Resistance Education).
  - Year 6 also take part in Sex and Relationship Education (SRE).



- Year 4 takes part in Keeping on Track.
- Year 3 takes part in Getting on Track.
- Year 2 take part in CASE (Children and Safety Education).
- We have close links with our local Community Police Officers who regularly visit school.
- All children take part in e-safety lessons. They understand their rights and responsibilities when using technology. They also take part in regular assemblies linked to e-safety.
- We have a team of Junior Road Safety Officers (JRSOs).
