- We challenge negative stereotypes and promote and respect differences between people.
- Our RE lessons promote an understanding of different faiths and cultures.
 - Adults within school work to develop an inclusive and tolerant environment for people of different faiths and beliefs.
- Children are given the opportunity to visit places of worship such as Southwell Minster and representatives from different faith groups are invited to visit the school.
- Children in Key Stage 2 spend time learning about the Holocaust. They visit the National Holocaust Centre and present a Holocaust assembly to the rest of the school.
- We celebrate different religions and festivals during collective worship.
 - For example Chinese New Year and Diwali.
- We have regular SEAL assemblies and Silver SEAL groups so children and adults are able to share and understand our school values.
